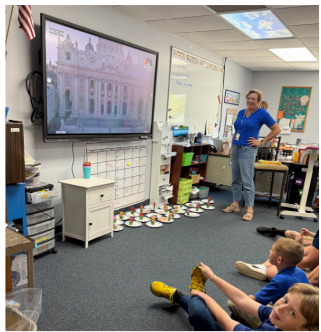


HIGHLIGHTS FROM SPRING 2025

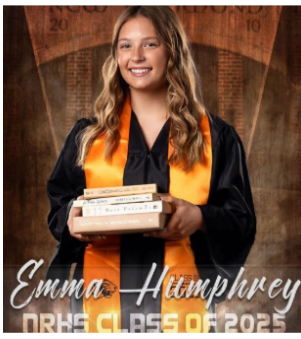

Maverick earned a ribbon at this spring's Math Masters event for his outstanding performance in the Fact Drill competition.

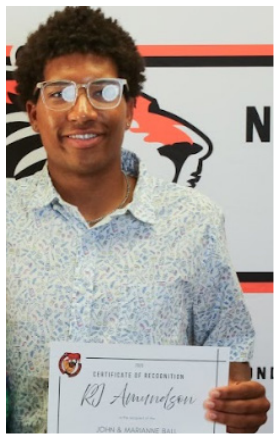


SMS ALUM
